


Personalized Learning: Sample Messages

These sample text messages are for the parent or caregiver of a 54-month-old child named Isaac. His ASQ-3 results indicate that he is above the cutoff in Personal-Social skills. He is close to the cutoff in Fine Motor, Gross Motor, and Communication skills and below the cutoff in Problem Solving.






FACT: Isaac is working on his communication skills. The more he talks, the more these skills will grow. Asking fun questions is a great way to really get Isaac talking!

TIP: At mealtime, ask Isaac: "Would you rather eat dinner with an elephant or a monkey? Why?" Make sure everyone at the table gets the chance to answer.

GROWTH: Keep asking silly questions to get Isaac talking. Now ask, "Would you rather have 8 arms or 8 legs? Why?" Take turns answering and listening.

Gross Motor:

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
FACT: Isaac's ASQ-3 results show he's working on gross motor skills, like balance. When kids do fun things like dance, play sports, or ride a bike, they build these skills. Challenge his balance with lots of play!

TIP: During playtime, challenge Isaac to pose like animals. Ask him to freeze as you pretend to snap a picture. Try being a cat, frog, and bear!

GROWTH: Keep building balance. Now shape Isaac into a statue. Can he hold the position for a count of 3? Let him shape you too. You're artists!

Fine Motor:



FACT: Isaac is working on his fine motor skills. Drawing is a fun way to develop these skills. As children draw, they build the motor skills that will lead to writing.

TIP: Before making dinner, set out crayons and paper. Say, "Can you draw a picture of me?" Write Isaac's name on it and hang it where everyone can see it!

GROWTH: Keep drawing! Now have Isaac draw a picture on a small piece of paper. Can he hide it in someone's shoe for them to find later?



FACT: Isaac's ASQ-3 results show his personal social skills are right on track. You can grow these skills by doing things that let Isaac take turns and share!

TIP: Share a set of blocks or other building toys during playtime. Build something together by taking turns adding blocks. As you do, say, "Your turn, my turn."

GROWTH: Keep taking turns! Invite Isaac to fill two bowls with a snack. As he does, say: "Some for me, some for you." Can he fill cups with water too?



FACT: Using position words like UP, DOWN, BEHIND or NEXT TO helps kids know where things are. It also helps kids build key early math skills.

TIP: At mealtime, use position words to say what you see. "I see 10 toes UNDER the table and 10 fingers ABOVE the table. I see your amazing face NEXT TO me!"

GROWTH: Keep using position words! At bath time, use a container to pour water. Pour NEXT TO, IN FRONT OF, and BEHIND Isaac. Talk about what you're doing!
